Dr. Imo Nse Imeh is a Nigerian-American visual artist and scholar of African Diaspora Art. He leverages his practice of visual art and research in art history to investigate historical and philosophical issues around the black body and cultural identity.

Dr. Imeh's work has been exhibited in numerous public venues including the Maison Lune (Los Angeles) for Art Frieze LA 2024, the August Wilson African American Cultural Center (Pittsburgh, PA), the Fine Arts Center Galleries of Bowling Green State University (Bowling Green, Ohio), the Sigal Museum of the Northampton County Historical and Genealogical Society (Easton, Pennsylvania), the Mariposa Museum (Oak Bluffs, Massachusetts), University Museum of Contemporary Art (Amherst, Massachusetts), the Urban Institute for Contemporary Art (Grand Rapids, Michigan).
